- We deliver a range of short and longer term programmes to **demonstrate** a children's human rights approach in practice and with this evidence build the skills and confidence of partners to **embed rights-based practice**.
- We support children to become child human rights defenders and to **influence** legislation, policy and practice.
- We grow public awareness about children's human rights with the aim to drive cultural change to create a nation that values children and delivers their rights.



Taking a child rights- based approach means using the UNCRC as a practical framework for working with and for children. Children are empowered to know about and claim their rights and duty bearers are accountable for ensuring that children experience their rights.
