Our Hearings, Our Voice is an independent Board for children and young people in Scotland who have experience of the Children's Hearings System. The Board is for children and young people aged 8-18.

**Aim:** To provide children and young people with the opportunity to effect positive, meaningful change and improvement by influencing decision-makers and service providers involved in the Children's Hearings System.

**Focus:** To help create shared understanding and long term improvements in the Hearings System based on children and young people's experiences.

#### **Key functions:**

- To identify and recommend improvements across the system.
- To scrutinise and support the work of partners across the Children's Hearings System.
- To hold the Children's Hearings System to account.
