Welcome to the first edition of the Inclusion Ambassador Update. It shares some of the points raised at recent meetings, includes a reminder of the resources available to support work around inclusion, and details how you can share progress and good practice.



1. Talking the talk

October Meeting: Priority planning

Our October meeting provided an opportunity to discuss the Inclusion Ambassador Vision Statement for Additional Support for Learning published in August for the Scottish Government (see resources and helpful reads) and identified priorities for the group over the next few months.

November Meeting: Transition from school

In our November meeting, we spoke to the group about transition journeys from secondary school.



We heard positive experiences around work experience opportunities, access to careers advisors and the availability of focused PSE classes. However, the group shared they would like more career advice meetings and for earlier preparation for leaving school, with support for beginning discussions around transitions beyond schools to start in S3 or S4.

Valuable lifeskills the group saw as key included how to keep themselves safe and happy, how to travel independently and money management.



Action: We will be sharing what the group told us with decision makers and it will feed into a future response to the Disabled Children and Young People (Transitions to Adulthood) (Scotland) Bill.
