We lead on a range of **projects** focusing on the voices of children and young people, gathering evidence about how best to respond to the needs of children and families and evaluating the impact of others' work. We have a dedicated Participation and Engagement staff team, our children and young people's advisory group Changing our World helps guide our decision-making, and young people have been represented on our Board of Directors since 2015.
