



Upstream


- Pilot in Edinburgh, West Lothian and Perth
- Universal screening tool targeting full year groups S3/S4

Pupils complete a questionnaire on:

- 1. School Life
- 2. Housing
- 3. Wellbeing
- 4. Resilience



How it works





Initial Results

• 1225 Young people surveyed

• 10 - 20% young people at risk of individual and/or family homelessness.

- 15% in Edinburgh & 35% in Perth & West Lothian reported high levels of conflict at home
- Across all schools, 90 93% reported low levels of wellbeing and many with low levels of resilience. In some year groups the scores were close to 100%
