We're looking for children and young people aged 11-25 to join our panel. If you are passionate about children and young people's access to the arts, we'd love to hear from you! We are particularly keen to hear from young people who've experienced their own barriers to enjoying creative activities.

How will I take part?

We're looking for **children and young people aged 11-25 to join our panel**. This will include taking part in 4-5 workshops between August and December. These meetings will be a mix of online and in person and we will work together to make improvements to the Fund, relaunch it and choose which projects to fund.

Children in Scotland will pay for your lunch, snacks and travel, and you will receive a **£50 voucher** at the end of the project as a thank you for taking part. We can also provide support if you need help to take part.

You don't need any previous experience. Passion matters more than experience, and we'll be here to help you at every step of the way.
