#### ? What is it?

The Inclusion Ambassadors are a group of young people who share their experiences of attending school and having additional support needs.

#### ? What will I have to do?

As a member of the group, you will attend Inclusion Ambassador meetings and tell us what you think about education for young people with additional support needs.

We talk about how things could be better at school and choose the best way to pass on this information to people in charge of making big decisions, like the Scottish Government. We work really hard to make the meetings a safe space to share and you can share at your own pace.

You might be invited to events and meetings to talk about your experiences and what needs to change.

Our team will support you the whole time, and you can also bring your own support staff to every meeting or event.

The group is run by the charity Children in Scotland and supported by Enquire – the national advice service for additional support for learning.
