What is the project about?

Children in Scotland have teamed up with The Electoral Commission, an independent body who oversee elections in the UK to set up a Youth Voice Network from 2023-2026 in Scotland.

We are looking for young people aged 12-18 who want to work together to help increase other young people's knowledge and understanding of democracy, voting and how young people can have their voices heard. There will also be the chance to collaborate with the other groups of young people that have been set up in the UK nations – Northern Ireland, Wales and England.

? What will it involve?

You will be part of a group of young people aged 12-18 working with Parisa and David. The group will meet approximately ten times a year (both online and inperson) where we will work together to create new ideas that raise awareness of democracy and voting for young people in Scotland.

You will get a chance to provide feedback to the Electoral Commission on their new campaigns and reports and create resources to support young people's voter registration in the run up to the Scottish Parliament election in 2026!

As a member of the group, you'll gain experience in teamwork, sharing your views on important issues and creating new ideas.

Why should I get involved?

This is a fun and interesting project to be involved in and you will get the chance to meet new people, learn new skills and share your thoughts and views on the matter to help engage more children and young people in the voting process.

If you are 12 years or older, you can also register the hours you work on the projects to gain **Saltire Awards** for volunteering.
