

Inclusion Ambassadors: The voice of experience

The Inclusion Ambassadors are a group of children and young people from across Scotland with a range of additional support needs. Children in Scotland works with the group to discuss issues that affect them and ensure their views are heard in decision-making relating to education.

Ensuring that the voices of children and young people are heard is key to upholding their right to education. It is also central to the Scottish Government's Additional Support for Learning Action Plan.

Based on our experience of working with the group, we have collated our Inclusion Ambassadors resources to help support practitioners and decision-makers to develop their practice in meaningfully engaging with young people with additional support needs.

These range from activities that can be done at school level to resource packs that can support strategic developments. Many provide example activities that you can use as a starting point for your work and to ensure you are listening to the voices of young people with additional support needs.
